Shingles vaccination

A vaccine to prevent shingles, a common, painful skin disease is now available on the NHS to anyone aged **70, 78 or 79**.

The shingles vaccine is given as a single injection. Unlike the flu jab, you'll only need to have the vaccination once. The vaccine is expected to reduce your risk of getting shingles. If you are unlucky enough to go on to have the disease, your symptoms may be milder and the illness shorter.

Shingles can be very painful and uncomfortable. Some people are left with pain lasting for years after the initial rash has healed. And shingles is fatal for around 1 in 1,000 over-70s who develop it.

It's fine to have the shingles vaccine if you've already had shingles. The shingles vaccine works very well in people who have had shingles before and it will boost your immunity against further shingles attacks.

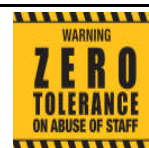
